Do you consider yourself a planner? Offer an example of what makes you say that.
When something knocks you off of your plan, it's called an obstacle. Describe your last obstacle.
When wondering if God has a plan for your life, have you ever wrestled with any of these issues? If so, which one and why?
• I don't know the plan.
• I messed up the plan.
• I don't believe there is a plan.
In <u>2 Corinthians 11:23-25</u> , Paul lists his life's obstacles. Looking back, what have been your life's obstacles?
In Romans 8, Paul tries to encourage believers who were wondering how obstacles could be part of God's plan.
•In verse 28, Paul uses the word "purpose". What is the difference between a purpose and a plan?
•In verse 29, Paul explains God's purpose. In your own words, what is God's purpose for Paul's lifefor <u>your</u> life?
Paul claims that God works for good "in all things" (Romans 8:28) when it comes to our lives. Have you seen God work in the obstacles of your life or someone else's life? How so?

Daily Prayer: God, I become so frustrated—even angry—with all the obstacles in my life. Help me know that you are at work in and through my obstacles for a purpose...that I might be conformed to the image of your Son, Jesus. Amen.

Altar Flowers


The altar flowers on Sunday, July 5 have been given in honor of Carl Hedberg who will celebrate his 91st birthday on July 5.
