



### **Reopening Update**

The Reopening Team met this week and we have, what I think is, exciting news to share! After carefully reviewing the NC Phase 2.5 guidelines along with revised guidelines from the Western North Carolina Conference, we plan to open our sanctuary to a limited number of worshipers beginning Sunday, October 4. Based on current guidelines, we will be limited to a maximum of 25 people in our sanctuary.

As we transition to a partial reopen, there are ways you can help. Specifically...

- You received a survey this week. The purpose of the survey is to gauge the frequency at which worshipers who are ready to return will be able to attend. For example, if 60 people indicate they are ready to return to the sanctuary for worship, this would mean that each worshiper could attend approximately every three weeks. You can help by submitting your survey.
- You will be asked to make a reservation if you desire to attend a worship service inperson. Information on how to make a reservation will be provided to you as soon as the details are finalized. You can help by **understanding** that, with a maximum of 25 people, you may not be able to attend every Sunday and that it will be necessary for you to make a reservation in advance.
- Please be prepared for worship to be different. One of the many changes has to do with our music. Unfortunately there will no congregational singing. Also, we will be taking your temperature, requesting that you arrive early wearing a mask, and asking you to enter and exit our sanctuary in a systematic way. You can help by **preparing** yourself for the changes that must occur for us to reopen.

I fully understand that returning to the sanctuary before the pandemic passes may not be what is best for you. And that is ok! Although every precaution will be taken to ensure your safety, if you are in an at-risk category please carefully consider whether in-person worship is right for you. For those who are unable to attend, we will continue to live stream our service on Facebook.

In closing, I want to thank you for your support and kind words of encouragement as I have adjusted to preaching in an empty sanctuary. No one is more anxious for our doors to be thrown wide open than I am! Let's pray that day is not too far off.




