

UMC Western NC Conference Annual Report Submitted by Frank Fields, Lay Delegate to the Annual Conference Sedgefield UMC



Due to Covid-19 travel and mass assembly restrictions, the 2020 Western North Carolina Annual Conference was conducted online this year. Conference staff made great efforts to organize the event so it would be meaningful and informative despite the limitations of on-line gatherings. There were a number of presentations, all of which had been thoughtfully prepared and recorded prior to the live streamed event on August 8. The topics of these reports included district updates, conference finances,

church vitality, racial justice and reconciliation efforts, and mission engagement. Even though we have all been challenged by health and safety concerns over the past few months, it was clear that our Church has remained not only active, but proactive during this time

In addition to reports, lay delegate and clergy attended to the normal business of the conference. This attention included a memoriam for those members lost during the preceding year, as well as the discontinuation of 17 churches whose membership had fallen to the point that they became unsustainable. Unfortunately, the loss of smaller churches is something that happens virtually every year, and serves as a reminder that the vitality of any church is fragile and dependent on careful nurturing of our congregations, their needs, and most importantly their faith.

Petitions and general business requiring votes to ratify or approve were securely conducted on-line. All agenda items brought before the conference were passed. One change that was out of the ordinary this year was the process of disaffiliation of seven churches. All petitions to disaffiliate were voted on individually, and all were approved.

Nominations Committee














