#### **Weekly Study Guide**

Something to Think About: None of us really like the word "discipline". Some even call it the "D-word".

That's because the word conjures up thoughts of things we know we ought to do, but we just don't want to do them. Eat healthier! Get up earlier! Exercise every day! Spend less and save more! Ugh... We know we ought to, but we just don't want to...right now, anyway. But there's a good side to discipline. Things that start out as disciplines sometimes become habits or lifestyles for which we become grateful. God invites us to be disciplined. If we can pull it off, our faith will grow, and life will be better!

When it comes to discipline in any area of your life, where do you struggle most?
Is there something you currently enjoy doing that began as a discipline? If s what made the discipline become enjoyable?
Can you think of disciplines you've developed that have strengthened your relationships with those you care about most? For example, calling mom of a regular basis; picking up after yourself; being punctual; saying "please" and "thank you".

Read Matthew 6:1-6. Jesus talks about the disciplines of generosity and prayer. With which of these are you the most faithful? With which of these do you struggle most? Explain.
Jesus warns against practicing these disciplines "in front of others to be seen by them". What do you think he means by that? What might that look like in today's world?
Jesus also speaks of being "rewarded" for these disciplines. How does this idea sit with you? Have you ever experienced a "reward" for practicing one or both of these disciplines? Explain.
In Sunday's sermon, you'll be challenged to give your first few dollars and your first few minutes to God every day for a period of time. What is your reaction to this challenge?

**Daily Prayer:** God, help me trust you with my bank account and my calendar. Give me discipline. Amen.


#### Sign Up To Attend Sunday Worship
