



### **Study Guide**

**Something to Think About**: The word "gospel" comes from the Old English, "*godspel*" which literally means "good story" or "good news". So if the gospel is "good news", why is it most of us allow our circumstances to snuff out our joy? After all, the first century world—a world that embraced the "good news"—faced circumstances far worse than ours. Maybe we've forgotten what the "good news" really is. Maybe the original, uncut, unfiltered version of the "good news" is really, really good!.

Read **Luke 1:1-4**. Read it again...slowly this time. What stands out to you, and why do you think Luke begins his Jesus-story in this way?

Think back on the Christmases in your life. What made for a "good" Christmas? Has your Christmas ever been less than good? If so, why?

How are you feeling about Christmas this year...and why?

Read Luke 2:10-14. Yes, I know it's familiar, but read it carefully. In verse 10, the angel brings "good news of great joy for all people." What was the "good news"? How did it bring "great joy"? And why do you think Luke made a point of saying it was for "all people"?

Read Luke 6:27-36. Does any part of this strike you as "good news"? Why or why not?

Does anything about Jesus or his teachings strike you as less than good news? If so, what? Why?

What, for you, is the best news about Jesus?


**Daily Prayer**: God, help me find the good news about Jesus today and every day despite my current circumstances. And show me ways to help others know of this same good news. Amen.
