

Something to Think About: So what was so good about the "good news of great joy for all people" announced to the first century shepherds? And if it was good news then, is it still good news? If so, what is it? We could all use a little good news today. The original Christmas story is packed with good news for the people of the first century—and—it's packed with good news for you. In the story of Mary and her cousin, Elizabeth, we find what is perhaps the best news of all. We have each other!

When it feels as if the wheels are coming off in your life, are you more likely to... 1) handle it yourself or 2) talk with someone about it? Does your way work? Why or why not?

If you've ever sought advice and wisdom from another person during a crisis, describe the circumstances, including how things turned out.

If you have a go-to person in your life when you need help, who is it? Why do you choose that person?

Has anyone ever come to you for advice or help? If so, describe the situation. Why do you think they chose you?

Read **Luke 1:26-45**. Luke says Mary was "confused" by the words of the angel. Why was Mary confused? What other emotions might Mary have been feeling?

Why did Mary choose Elizabeth to talk to (Luke 1:5-25), and why was Mary in such a hurry to see her (1:39)?

Who is your "Elizabeth", and for whom could you be "Elizabeth" in this Christmas season?

Daily Prayer: God, give me the wisdom to seek a wise friend or relative for advice when I need it, and help me be that wise friend or relative for someone else. Thank you for the gift of each other. Amen.




