The Gift of Pain
2 Corinthians 12:7-10





### **Study Guide**

**Something to Think About**: Occasionally you run into people who seem to be OK even when their lives are anything but OK. One of the remarkable things about such people is that many have come to see their adversity as if it were a gift from God. They know God did not cause their pain, and yet they receive their pain...they actually embrace their pain...as if God actually wanted them to have it. This is a strange but powerful idea that is worth exploring.

Do you believe that God sends painful circumstances into your life, perhaps for a higher purpose? Looking back on your faith journey, how did you arrive at your conclusion?
Do you believe that faith in God reduces or eliminates adversity? Why or why not? Explain your opinion, and please be specific.
Do you see a conflict between facing adversity and the existence of an all-powerful and all-loving God? Why or why not?
Have you ever known someone who continued to project joy, hope and purpose in the midst of their difficult circumstances? Did their faith have any affect on your faith? Explain.

Read <b>2 Corinthians 12:7-10</b> . The original Greek word for "given" is " <i>didomi</i> " which is reserved for gifts that bring happiness and joy, much like a Christmas gift. And yet, Paul says this gift "tormented" him. Is it possible for these two concepts to be compatible? Why or why not?
Paul says he "pleaded" with God that this gift be taken away. Have you ever pleaded with God for something? How did it turn out?
How did God respond to Paul? Has God ever responded to your prayers in a similar way?
Paul claims there is purpose in his pain. What is that purpose?
Notice this detail—Paul says, "when I am weak, I am strong." He doesn't say, "When I am weak, God is strong." What is the difference between these two thoughts?

<u>Daily Prayer</u>: God, I know you do not cause my pain, but help me receive it as if it were a gift from you...a gift with a purpose. Amen.


