

Reflections From Pastor Tom



Dear Friends, this Sunday is the first Sunday in the season of Lent (Lent will have begun on Ash Wednesday, February 14). I will be preaching on Mark 1:9-15, Mark's very brief description of Jesus's temptation in the wilderness and transition to his public ministry.

For several generations, our society has had a desire for immediate gratification. Maybe it's always been a problem. We want what

we want right now. We don't want to wait for anything. With online shopping and home delivery services, the problem has only gotten worse in recent years. It is easy for us to criticize these impatient tendencies as immature or irresponsible.

However, this week's Scripture lesson shows that not all urgency is bad, as long as it comes from the proper motivation. Mark the Gospel writer doesn't include the details of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness by Satan, but instead, he jumps ahead to the beginning of Jesus's ministry. Jesus must have shown great patience during those 40 days but as soon as he arrived in Galilee, he got to work proclaiming an urgent message. Jesus knew when to slow down and when to move quickly. He understood the difference between urgency and impatience. Do we know that difference?

Symbols of Lent



The Cross was a wooden post with a wooden cross-beam used to execute Jesus. It eventually became the primary symbol of the Christian religion. The cross is significant both for what it meant at the time of Jesus's crucifixion, that is DEATH, and what it came to mean for Christians - unconditional, sacrificial love and surprisingly, LIFE. The cross is also a reminder that nothing is impossible for God and in what seems to be a defeat and a failure, God can be victorious and successful.

Registration is now open for the 2024 Metro District Lay Servant Ministry training! We are offering basic and advanced classes at Central UMC, Charlotte April 13-14 as well as an advanced course via Zoom. Class size is limited so register early. Deadline to register is March 31.

Remember, if you are a Certified Lay Servant or want to become a Certified Lay Servant, you **must** take an advanced course every three years (and have completed the Basic course).

The ministry of the laity is vital to our churches, district, communities, conference and the world! Lay Servant Ministry is a way we, as lay persons, can grow spiritually, become equipped to serve, discover our spiritual gifts and ways to use them, and experience connection and fellowship with other Lay Servants.

The training is open to all laity, provided you have spoken to your pastor and received the recommendation for taking the course you choose. I will contact them after you register to ask for their approval. All Lay Servants must be approved by their church council/charge conference and have the approval of their pastor to participate in Lay Servant Ministry.

Registration fee for in person courses is \$15 and the fee for the Zoom course is \$10.

BASIC

<u>Lay Servant Ministries, Participants Book</u> (Basic Course) by Sandy Jackson and Brian Jackson

"This course is foundational for all courses in Lay Servant Ministries. Participants are encouraged to discover and employ personal spiritual gifts as God intended and to consider the importance of exercising servant leadership, developing future leaders, remaining rooted in consistent spiritual practices, and being part of a group that holds members accountable in their discipleship."

ADVANCED COURSES

<u>The Method of Our Mission</u> by Laceye C. Warner. (Polity Course) This course gives participants an overview of the structure and organization of The United Methodist Church. It uses a Wesleyan theological frame – connection – to help students understand United Methodist Polity and organization. (Offered both in person and via Zoom)

<u>The Caring Congregation Ministry Implementation Guide by</u> Karen Lampe & Melissa Gepford. This new advanced course, Exploring a Culture of Care for a Caring Congregation, uses the book <u>The Caring Congregation Ministry Implementation Guide</u>, to equip participants with tools for deep listening and grow their capacity to care in difficult situations of loss – all within healthy boundaries and a thoughtful awareness of the varying cultural contexts of caring ministry.

<u>Sharing the Prayers of the People: The Art of Intersession</u> by Samuel Wells and Abigail Kocher. Praying in public can be daunting, but prayer is something one learns. This course on praying in public will help the participant grow in confidence and skill in public prayer and enrich their personal prayer life.


