Dear Friends, This Sunday, I will be preaching on Luke 4:1-13 and my title will be "Do No Harm."

Although most people assume that the phrase "First do no harm" is a part of the Hippocratic Oath that doctors take, actually, those words don't appear in the oath - at least not in that way. The oath includes the words "... I will abstain from all intentional wrongdoing and harm..." That's pretty close. It is a great

ethical foundation for doctors and for all of us.

As we begin the season of Lent, we are invited to re-commit ourselves to God in specific ways. If we choose to celebrate Lent by making promises and commitments, it will be most meaningful if we give up something or add something that matters to us. We want to choose a change that will draw us closer to God.

The Scripture lesson this week is Jesus's temptation in the wilderness. Satan tried to divert and distract Jesus from his assigned mission as Messiah, but Jesus refused to fall for Satan's tricks. Notice both the supposed good and the real harm that could have been done if Jesus had said yes to Satan. However we choose to spend our Lenten season, we should consider the good and harm that we do. I look forward to seeing you in worship on Sunday.

The Symbols of Lent



The Cross was a wooden post with a wooden cross-beam used to execute Jesus. It eventually became the primary symbol of the Christian religion. The cross is significant both for what it meant at the time of Jesus's crucifixion, that is DEATH, and what it came to mean for Christians - unconditional, sacrificial love and surprisingly, LIFE.

The cross is also a reminder that nothing is impossible for God and in what seems to be a defeat and a failure, God can be victorious and successful.

All courses will be held at University City UMC, 3835 W W.T. Harris Blvd., Charlotte - (You MUST attend all ten hours to receive credit for the course.)




