

Reflections From Pastor Tom



Dear Friends,

This Sunday we will have Holy Communion and there will be a special children's time in worship. I will be preaching on John 12:1-8 and my title will be "What Was She Thinking?" (For the record, this title is not connected to Leigh's preaching at all, but it is pretty funny that it lined up that way).

The "she" in the title refers to Mary, sister of Martha and Lazarus, who anointed Jesus's feet with expensive perfume. This story is told in all four

Gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. While Mark and Matthew's versions are similar, Luke and John tell it a little differently. Mark and Matthew put it right before the Last Supper but Luke puts it much earlier in Jesus's ministry. John puts it later in the order of events, but in John's version, it is not some unknown woman coming in off the street. In John, the anointing is done by a close friend, Mary, in her brother Lazarus's house. These differences may not matter significantly for us, but it is interesting how the writers all tell it differently.

On Sunday we will talk about strange, reckless behavior. We have all been in awkward situations when someone acts or speaks inappropriately. Sometimes YOU are the one behaving strangely. What were YOU thinking? How do we respond in these situations? What is the Christ-like response? The disciples received a lesson from Jesus in this story. It was uncomfortable and those present had different thoughts going through their minds. In the sermon, I will discuss how Jesus used the incident as a teaching moment. I look forward to seeing you in worship.

The Lifesaving Gift: Why Blood Donation Matters

Every few seconds, someone in the world needs a blood transfusion. Whether due to accidents, surgeries, or medical conditions like anemia or cancer, the demand for blood is constant. However, blood cannot be manufactured - it can only come from the support of generous donors who choose to give this lifesaving gift. Approximately 62% of the population is eligible to donate blood yet only 3% of those who are eligible actually donate blood.

Blood transfusions are essential in medical emergencies and help to manage chronic medical conditions. *A single blood donation can help save up to three lives,* making each contribution incredibly impactful. There are many reasons patients need blood:

- More than 25% of the blood supply is used by patients battling cancer
- 1 out of every 83 childbirths will require a blood transfusion
- 3.2% of the blood supply is used to treat pediatric patients
- Patients with sickle cell disease, cancer, and severe anemia rely on regular transfusions to maintain their health and quality of life.

Without a steady blood supply, hospitals and medical facilities would struggle to meet patient needs.

Donating blood is safe, quick, and usually takes less than an hour. When you donate, you will find the process to be simple and easy. We are using OneBlood for the upcoming blood drive in Sedgefield. OneBlood is a non-profit organization that supplies blood and blood products to our community and the surrounding areas. Besides the opportunity to give back to your community, YOU will also receive perks for donating such as tasty snacks, gift cards and other fun items.

Blood donation is a vital act of kindness that saves lives and strengthens communities. By giving blood, donors provide hope to patients in need and help ensure a stable healthcare system. The simple decision to donate can have a profound impact, proving that a small act of generosity can make a world of difference.

To be eligible to donate blood you must:

- be at least 17 years old (16 with parental permission in some states)
- meet height and weight requirements (at least 110 pounds based on height)
- be in generally good health

Before donating you should:

- get a good night's sleep
- drink plenty of fluids
- eat within 2-3 hours

We hope to see you at the upcoming blood drive on April 6th. The Big Red Bus will be in the church parking lot.
